

Project Background as of Today

- 2008 Feasibility Study (Great Recession)
- 2017 Revisioning of the Community Center
 - 22-Person Community Center Advisory Committee (CAC) and Community Outreach
- 2020 Covid-19 Pandemic
- 2024 Re-established CAC to support bond and private fundraising







About the Proposed Bond Measure

The City of Woodburn bond measure proposed for this November's ballot would fund the expansion and improvements of Woodburn's Aquatic center into a full-service community center including:

- Indoor Walk/Jog ٠ Track
- Multi-Court Gym •
- New Exercise Space ٠ & Equipment
- New Fitness Rooms

- Event and Conference Space
- Commercial Kitchen
- Child Watch
- Collaboration Spaces

- Warm Water Rec/Therapy Pool
- Splash Pad
- New Water Slide
- New Saunas
- Pool Party Room
 New Locker Rooms





A community multi-purpose room and event spaces (3,200+ sqft) with a commercial kitchen that can be used for special events, senior meal programs, job training opportunities, local nonprofits, and as an incubator space for small businesses.












Fitness & Wellness



The total cost of the project is \$60 million. After a significant amount of advocacy, the City ultimately secured a \$15 million grant from the Oregon Legislature and committed \$5 million in City funds that can be utilized after the City unlocks matching funds through the passage of a \$40 million bond measure. The matching funds from the state will only be available if the project is fully funded by Spring 2025.

In addition to state and local funds, the City, in partnership with Woodburn Proud, has launched a capital campaign to secure funding from private donors and foundations.



Funding Sources & Cost

The bond would cost approximately \$1.00 per \$1,000 of assessed property value, or \$15 per month for the average homeowner in Woodburn.
