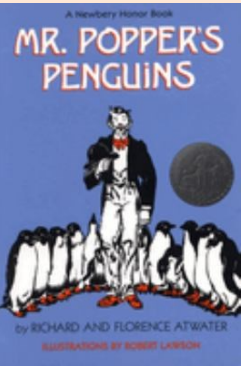
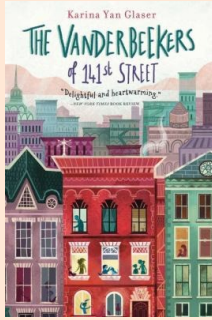


## ***The Vanderbeekers of 141st Street***

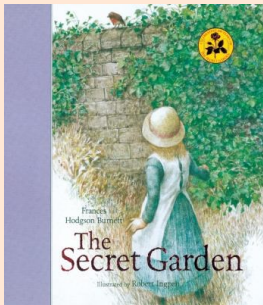
## ***Mr. Popper's Penguins***

## ***The Secret Garden*** by Frances Hodgson Burnett

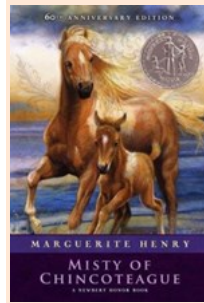
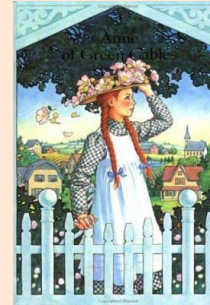
Ten-year-old Mary comes to live in a lonely house in England and meets a cousin and discovers a secret garden. 240 pages.

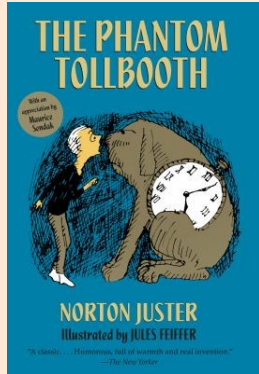

by Juster Norton**

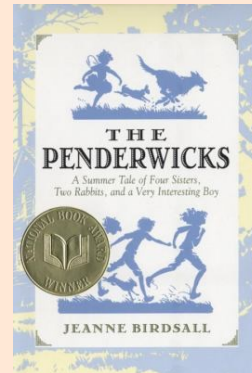

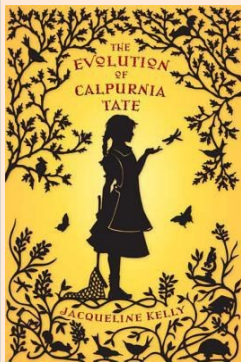

The story of a young boy's love for two hunting dogs and his coming of age in Oklahoma in the 1930's. Readers may need tissues. 212 pages.

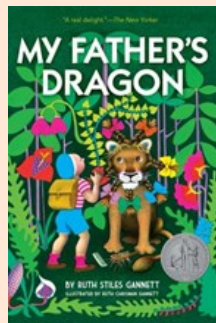


***The Evolution of

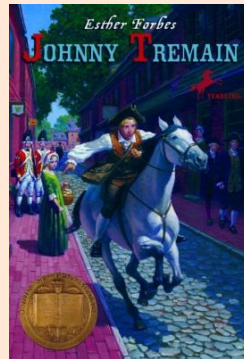
***My Father's Dragon*

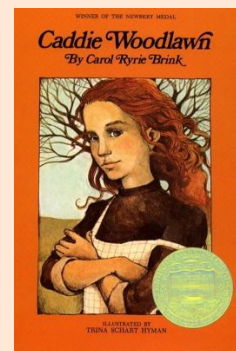
***Johnny Tremain*

Johnny Tremain, a young apprentice silversmith, is caught up in the danger and excitement of 1775 Boston, just before the Revolutionary War. 256 pages.



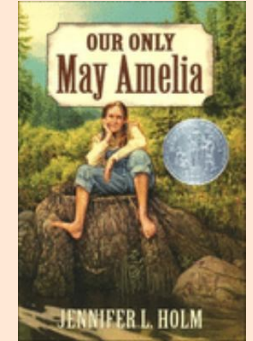
***Caddie
